<b>FEATURES OF WRITING</b>		<b>/10</b>	
To compose a sentence orally before writing it down.	1		
To write sentences in order to create short narratives and non-fiction texts.	2		
To use some features of different text types (although these may not be consistent). <i>See the additional sheets for each text type.</i>	2		
To reread their writing to check that it makes sense and make suggested changes.	2		
To use simple sentence structures.	1		
To start sentences in different ways.	2		
<b>ADDING DETAIL AND DESCRIPTION</b>		<b>/4</b>	
To use adjectives to describe. <i>An adjective is a 'describing' word eg the brown, furry, bear</i>	2		
To use the joining word (conjunction) 'and' to link ideas and sentences.	2		
<b>PUNCTUATION</b>		<b>/12</b>	
To use capital letters for names, places, the days of the week and the personal pronoun 'I'.	2		
To use a capital letter to start most new sentences.	2		
To use full stops to end most sentences.	2		
To use a question mark correctly when asking a question within writing.	2		
To use an exclamation mark correctly to add emphasis when writing.	2		
To use clear finger spaces between each word when writing.	2		
<b>SPELLING AND HANDWRITING</b>		<b>/14</b>	
Can hold a pencil correctly with the correct pencil grip.	1		
To use 'fred fingers' to segment words. <i>Eg when spelling 'moon' we would separate it into the phonemes - m-oo-n before writing it down.</i>	1		
To use phonemes from Set 2 RWI when spelling unfamiliar words. <i>See separate sound mat.</i>	2		
To show an awareness of alternative ways of spelling phonemes (Set 3 RWI) when spelling unfamiliar words. <i>See separate sound mat.</i>	2		
To spell most Y1 common exception words and days of the week accurately - <i>See Year One word list for included words</i>	2		

To use -s and -es to form regular plurals correctly. <i>Eg bus – buses, cat – cats, chair – chairs</i>	1	
To use the prefix 'un'. <i>Eg <u>un</u>happy, <u>un</u>kind</i>	1	
To add the suffixes -ing, -ed, -er and -est to root words (with no change to the root word). <i>A root word is the original word before the suffix is added eg help – <u>helping</u>, short – <u>shorter</u></i>	1	
To spell simple compound words <i>eg sandpit, blackbird</i>	1	
To write lower case and capital letters in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place with a good level of consistency.	2
