

<p><b>English</b> <b>Punctuation and inverted commas</b></p> <p>Use this site to make fake conversations between movie characters. <a href="https://ifaketextmessage.com/">https://ifaketextmessage.com/</a></p> <p>Write them properly using inverted commas. <b>How to use direct speech poster.</b> <b>Direct speech assessment questions.</b></p>	<p><b>English</b> <b>Using apostrophes</b></p> <p><b>Apostrophes for omission</b> are used in contractions where a letter has been omitted (taken out) Example: do not → don't</p> <p><b>Apostrophes for possession</b> show who owns something. If you're not sure, put a box around the owner, then put the apostrophe outside. Example: The <span style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 2px;">children</span>'s coats were on the floor. The <span style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 2px;">teacher</span>'s voice was angry.</p> <p><b>Apostrophe police! Look at these bad examples – how should they be written?</b></p>	<p><b>English</b> <b>Using ellipsis</b></p> <p>Look for examples of ellipsis in your reading book. They should be used for effect – not overused!</p>	<p><b>English</b> <b>Using brackets</b></p> <p>If the information in the brackets is a full sentence, remember to punctuate it with a capital letter and full stop.</p> <p>Parenthesis is extra information which can be added using brackets, dashes or commas. It can be removed and the sentence will still make sense. Look out for examples in your reading book.</p>	<p><b>English</b> <b>Reading lesson: London Eye Mystery by Siobhan Dowd</b></p>  <p>Recommended book - Ted and Kat follow a trail of clues across London in a desperate bid to find their cousin and find the key to the mystery.</p> <p>You could research London landmarks and map them, sketch them or write facts about them.</p>
