

<p>Maths Area and perimeter of rectilinear (using straight lines) shapes</p> <p>See the prompts below related to area and perimeter.</p> <p>Look at the floor plan. Can you work out how many square metres of carpet would be needed to cover each room? (Calculate the area.) Can you calculate the perimeter of each room? Remember to include unlabelled sides.</p>	<p>Maths Calculate the area of triangles</p> <p>Calculate the area of triangles on the sheet.</p> <p>*Challenge* A triangle has a base measurement of 12cm. It has an area of 36cm². What is the height of the triangle? Draw two different triangles which it could be.</p>	<p>Maths Calculate the area of parallelograms</p> <p>Calculate the area of a parallelogram the same as you would for a rectangle – just think that it's gone a bit slanted!</p> <p>Calculate the area of each patch in the rose garden.</p>	<p>Maths Calculate, estimate and compare volume of cubes</p> <p>Complete the estimating volume sheet. If you have cubes of blocks at home, try visualising the shapes then making them to check. Don't forget the cubes that you can't see but are needed to make the solid structure.</p>	<p>Maths Challenge of the week</p> <p>Let me know how you get on with today's maths challenges! ☺</p> <p>Make jottings and drawings when working out, to help you understand what the question is asking.</p>
<p>History Kingdom of Benin</p> <p>Create a research map on Benin. Make sure you study the Ancient Kingdom of Benin, not the modern Republic of Benin. Can you find out the difference between these two places?</p>	<p>Geography Florida</p> <p>Create a guide for why people should visit Florida. You could focus on one particular aspect or tourist attraction. Use the planning sheet.</p> <p>Create an information book about Florida, including the location, weather, industry and tourist attractions.</p>	<p>Science Features of sound</p> <p>Create a glossary of these words: pitch, volume, frequency, wavelength.</p> <p>Complete the seeing sound experiment.</p>	<p>Design and Technology Iterative Design</p> <p>This is a circular design process whereby designers keep creating, testing and redesigning.</p> <p>Design a boat using the activity sheet for the design process. Maybe you have your own idea for a new invention? Design it. What could be the drawbacks? 


The distance
